

## Admission Process for Patients Designated as Either COVID/PUI or COVID TESTING LAB SCREEN

## 1. ED Provider assesses patient and determines COVID status

- > COVID/PUI Admit to COVID floor
- Patient to be admitted with potential symptoms of COVID-19 infection, including: fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea, and /or sore throat and a clinical assessment supporting a presumptive diagnosis of COVID/PUI
- Patient without symptoms coming from congregate living settings (LTC, shelter, prison) with a known high incidence of COVID positive testing based on surveillance monitoring
  - COVID TESTING LAB SCREEN Admit to Non-COVID floor
- Patient to be COVID tested for surgery or procedure, does not have any symptoms of COVID (not a PUI)
- Patient assessed as not being a PUI from congregate living settings (LTC, shelter, prison) that have no identified significant COVID positive incidence
- Subacute rehabilitation patients
- Hemodialysis patient

## 2. ED provider enters bed request

- All COVID/PUI patients will be admitted to the 9<sup>th</sup> floor on the Infinity Hospital service at BGMC and 3W or 2N for telemetry at MFSH
- All COVID/PUI patients are admitted as inpatient and not in OBS status
- COVID Testing Lab Screen patients can be inpatient or OBS status
- 3. Admitting provider completes History & Physical
  - > Assessment of COVID status is different than ED provider assessment
  - ED Attending to Hospitalist Attending discussion must occur to determine proper bed placement of patient
  - If Hospitalist Attending is unavailable, ED Attending assessment and bed placement stands
- 4. If a patient has a resulting negative COVID test while on the Infinity Hospital service they will continue to care for the patient
- 5. If a patient becomes COVID positive on a non-COVID floor, the patient will be moved to a COVID floor and the admitting medicine service will continue to care for the patient on the COVID floor
