On behalf of the California Association of Certified Family Law Specialists, a non-profit organization with 660 members who are certified as family law specialists by the State Bar of California, Board of Legal Specialization, I write to support Assembly Bill 3365, as introduced.

ACFLS supports Section 1 of the bill because if clarifies the date on which the county clerk must issue a duplicate confidential marriage license to one year of the date of the marriage and the date on which the person solemnizing the marriage must return the license to the clerk to one year of the date of the marriage.

ACFLS supports Section 2 of the bill because it would delete the provision that would become operative on January 1, 2021, thereby maintaining the net disposable income threshold at \$1,500 per month, adjusted annually for cost-of-living increases, indefinitely. This is good law and it makes sense to increase the net disposable income threshold indefinitely.



ACFLS supports Section 3 of the bill because these provisions are declaratory of existing law.
